Games will be played according to current FINA Rules. Possible new rules will be enforced in Round 3 after the decision of the FINA Congress taken in December 2018.

2 FINA TWPC Experts and 2 LEN Experts will cooperate regarding appointments of Delegates and Referees.

If no agreement is reached, FINA TWPC position will prevail.

# 7. Competition System

### **Competition System MEN:**

- a) Round 1: Tournament
- b) <u>Round 2</u>: sixteen (16) teams selected as follows:
  - eight (8) teams from the previous edition of the FINA Water Polo World League
  - eight (8) teams qualified through the European Qualification (Round 1)
  - if there are less teams from the previous WPWL, further teams from Round 1 will qualify
  - Teams shall be drawn into four (4) groups. In each group each team shall play against each of the other teams on a HOME and AWAY basis (Double Round Robin).

c) <u>Round 3</u>: Eight (8) teams ranked 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in each group of Round shall qualify. In the group including the host of Round 4 (if applicable), the host and the highest placed other team of this group will qualify.

Round 3 shall grand to the winner the Europa Cup. The final ranking of the Europa Cup will qualify four teams (including the host of Round 4 if applicable) to the Round 4.

- a) Round 1: Tournament
- b) Round 2: twelve (12) teams selected as follows:
  - four (4) teams from the previous edition of the FINA Water Polo World League
  - eight (8) teams qualified through the European Qualification (Round 1)
  - if there are less teams from the previous WPWL, further teams from Round 1 will qualify

Teams shall be drawn into four (4) groups. In each group each team shall play against each of the other teams on a HOME and AWAY basis (Double Round Robin).

c) <u>Round 3</u>: Eight (8) teams ranked 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> from each group of Round 2 shall qualify. In the group including the host of Round 4 (if applicable), the host and the highest placed other team of this group will qualify.

Round 3 shall grand to the winner the Europa Cup. The final ranking of the Europa Cup will qualify three teams (plus the host of Round 4 if applicable) to the Round 4.
